

JOB SUMMARY

The **Facilities Maintenance Attendant** is responsible for facility & site maintenance at the ORC. The site includes the two boathouses and the grounds at the Ottawa Rowing Club (ORC) at its Ottawa River Location.

Reporting to the ORC Administrator, this position executes the regular maintenance tasks including lawn cutting, gardening, driveway cleaning, bush trimming, and minor outdoor facility repairs including repairs to docks, doors, windows, etc. Indoor tasks for this role includes cleaning the facility including gym, office, changerooms, washrooms, and boat storage areas, along with minor repairs to lighting, plumbing, and audio-visual amenities.

Along with maintenance tasks, the Maintenance Attendant is responsible for the set-up and take down of equipment in the Boathouse Wedding Venue. This is a customer facing aspect of the role that requires professional communication, cleaning, lifting, and attention to detail.

PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE

- High School Graduate or college/university student
- Experience in the skilled trades or custodial services is highly desirable
- Knowledge of Workplace OHSA responsibilities is desirable

CERTIFICATIONS AND LICENSES

- Certification or enrollment in a skilled trade is an asset but not a requirement
- Ontario Class G Drivers Licence is preferable
- Workplace Hazardous Materials Information System (WHMIS). Can be obtained upon hire.

Knowledge

- General understanding of physical facility amenities, including basic knowledge of plumbing, electrical, audio, visual, and mechanical systems.
- Basic cleanliness principles, including personal hygiene and cleanliness of a range of areas on site.
- Safe handling practices of gas, electric and hand powered tools.
- Must have knowledge of risk management for decision making related to health and safety of self, staff & members.
- Language Requirement: English OR Bilingual competencies.

- Operate light power tools including drills, reciprocating saws, circular saws, heat guns, lawn mowers, weed whackers etc.
- Operate hand tools including but not limited to, hammers, screwdrivers, pliers, cutters, pruners, etc.
- Clean bathroom facilities with attention to detail and proper chemical handling
- Follow verbal and/or written directions/procedures.
- Communicate effectively using written, verbal, and visual methods.
- Customer service skills
- Manage time and maintain organization.
